## **I. Overview**

The 2022-23 Diploma in Mountain Medicine of the Japan Mountaineering Medical Association (DiMM-JP) is held every two years by UIAA Medcom (Medical Commission of International Climbing and Mountaineering Federation), ISMM (International Society of Mountain Medicine), and ICAR (International Commission for Alpine Rescue) has been certified. This program aims to train medical doctors, nurses, and paramedics who can learn the theory and practices for diseases and trauma that could occur in mountainous areas and practice clinical and research in mountain medicine. Students who completed these programs and passed each exam will be awarded the Diploma in Mountain Medicine. Normally, these programs are required to be completed within 5 years from the entry to our DiMM program, and if it exceeds 5 years, even if it has been taken, it will be required to take it again for items that have passed 5 years, but the above 5 years will be extended 6 years each due to current situation of COVID-19. The program will be revised by the DiMM Committee or the UIAA / ISMM / ICAR regulation revisions. In that case, remedies will be applied to students who entered in the old program according to the old program.

## **II. Target person**

### **① Medical Doctor Course**

Medical Doctors who are members of the Japanese Society of Mountain Medicine (JSMM) and have completed the initial clinical training (graduates before the introduction of the clinical training system should be read as "doctors who have obtained a doctor's license") can register. From 2020, initial clinical residents and medical students will not be able to register.

### **② Nurse Course**

Those who are members of the Japanese Society of Mountain Medicine (JSMM) and have a registered nursing qualification can register. The content of the course is the same as that of a medical doctor. Nursing students will not be able to register from 2020.

### **③ Paramedic Course**

Those who are members of the Japanese Society of Mountain Medicine (JSMM) and have a qualification as an emergency medical technician can register. The content of the course is the same as that of a medical doctor. Paramedic students will not be able to register from 2020.

All students are should be well prepared academically before taking the course. It is highly recommended that those who have little experience in mountaineering should take a mountaineering technique class or rescue technique class by various mountaineering groups or mountain guides in advance.

- All of the above A, B, and C courses must be completed. A total of 121 hours.
- It is recommended to take the C courses in the order C1, C2, C3 and C4.
- Post-paper test may be imposed after each B course. Only attending a class with assignments does not mean that you have passed. Only if you submit by the deadline for submitting the assignment will be graded, and the pass or fail will be judged based on the graded result.
- In C, practical skills during the examination days will be scored. After the pass or fail notification, an objection can be filed with the Examination Committee Chair through each test implementation manager.
- The program equivalent at the time of registration will be applied to all courses and certifications.

### IV. Eligibility, registration procedure, registration fee

- It is necessary that you are a member of the Japanese Society of Mountain Medicine and have not delinquently paid the academic society membership fee. Please see the website of the Japanese Society of Mountain Medicine for the enrollment procedure.

- Please access [http://www.jsmmed.org/dimmjpn\\_entry.html](http://www.jsmmed.org/dimmjpn_entry.html), select a course that suits your qualifications, and perform temporary registration. A registration fee of 10,000 JPY is required for formal registration. Please pay to the bank account mentioned in the e-mail sent from the DiMM administrative team after confirming your eligibility.
- For each course, the application guidelines will be posted on the website and the registered students will be notified on the e-mailing list. If you apply according to the application guidelines for each course and the course is approved, please pay the course fee. After confirming the payment of the course fee, you will be confirmed as a student. The course fee does not include transportation to the venue, accommodation during the course, and food, drinks and stuff for personal using. After approving the course participate, the person in charge will contact you regarding the payment method for accommodation and food expenses in the exercises and certifications, so please follow the instructions.
- To take C, you must have mountain insurance (which can also be applied to winter mountain climbing, rock climbing, ice climbing, distress and mountain accidents during mountain skiing). In addition, C1 completion is required for C2 attendance, and C2 pass and C3 completion are required for C4 attendance.

## **V. Cancellation Policy and Course Restrictions**

- The registration fee is non-refundable after payment.
- In principle, the tuition fee for each course and examination will not be refunded for any reason unless the course is canceled or the course is restricted due to the organizer's circumstances.
- For safety reasons, attendance may be restricted depending on the circumstances of the venue and the number of people and mountain climbing experience in mountain practice, exercises, and certifications. After the application deadline for each course, the person in charge of the course and the certification will contact you regarding the availability of the course.

## **VI. Transitional Measures, Domestic Certified Mountain Physician / Mountain Nurse Program**

- New entries to the Japanese Society of Mountain Medicine certified domestic mountaineering doctor / mountain nurse program (hereinafter referred to as the domestic certified mountaineering doctor / Mountain nurse program) had already been completed. From now on, we will continue the domestic certified mountain doctor / mountain nurse program until 2023, but the qualification will be completed by the end of 2023 (if the certification requirements are not met by the end of 2023, we will not be certified). If you have been thinking about acquiring a new qualification as a domestic certified mountain doctor / mountain nurse, please consider the DiMM program or the Japanese Mountaineering Medical Association specialist (nurse) system.

- For students who have already entered the domestic certified mountain doctor / mountain nurse program and have started some courses, will they continue to take the domestic certified mountain doctor / mountain nurse program (however, it will end in 2023)? , There are options for transition to the DiMM program or the Japanese Society of Mountain Climbing Medical Specialist (Nurse) system (special transition measures by the end of 2025).
- Those who have obtained domestic certified mountain doctor / mountain nurse qualifications can take advantage of the special measures scheduled to be set for 5 years from 2021 to either the DiMM program or the Japanese Society of Mountain Climbing Medical Specialist (Nurse) system. We recommend that you migrate to Crab (special migration measures by the end of 2025). For the transition to DiMM, it is necessary to retake the Natsuyama test, Fuyuyama test and Beacon test and pass each of the DiMM standards.

## **VII. About DiMM credential**

- After taking all the courses and certifications of A1, B1 to B4, and C1 to C4, and passing the examination and certification, the contents will be confirmed and the DiMM administrative team will finally qualify. The certification period is currently being adjusted.
- Diploma in Mountain Medicine will be granted after qualification.

## **VIII. DiMM renewal**

- Due to changes in international regulations, the DiMM qualification renewal system will be introduced. It is necessary to renew within 5 years after obtaining Diploma in Mountain Medicine. For details, please refer to the PDF of the DiMM qualification renewal system guide.

Knots and their uses: Fishermen’s knot, figure of eight, Prusik, clove hitch, Munter (Italian) hitch; tying into a harness; Creating an anchor system; belaying; abseiling with descender and prusik; ascent of fixed rope with prusiks; ability to follow on a UIAA grade 3 climb: preparing a landing site for helicopter evacuation; ground to air hand signals.

▪ **Winter**

Glacier travel and walking on ice with crampons; belaying by using a variety of techniques suited to snow and ice; climbing grade WI (Winter Ice) 2; improvised crevasse rescue including simple pulley systems; locating a buried avalanche victim using a transceiver and probes, extracting the victim and preparing for rescue, emergency shelters.
